Assistance to Communities

Community projects and the amount of the grants for each will vary based on DSWD, thru the participatory situational analysis of the community where the families will be integrated or relocated.

- Community Grants to assist LGUs in projects needed to develop or rehabilitate resettlement areas. This package includes:
 - » Municipal Grant Allocation for basic services up to Php 7.5 million.
 - » Social Preparation Activities up to Php 500,000.00 per municipality.

» Capacity Building Intervention for volunteers and Barangay/Municipal LGUs up to Php 300,000.00 per municipality.


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The Balik Probinsya Bagong Pag-asa or BP2 program aims to boost countryside development and provide a better future for Filipinos by encouraging Metro Manila's urban poor to return to their home province.

To support their transition to the province, BP2 provides support and incentives on transportation, family, livelihood, housing, subsistence, and education, among others.

The program focuses on four key areas:

- Empowerment of Local Industries
- Food Security and Agricultural Productivity
- Development of Infrastructure
- Social Welfare, Health and Employment

Assistance to Families

The types of services and total amount of assistance to be provided per family will vary based on the assessment of DSWD's social workers in coordination and collaboration with the local social welfare officers and other staff from DSWD's field offices.

- Transportation/Relocation
 Assistance of Php 3,000.00 to Php 35,000.00 for family beneficiaries to move their properties and belongings from their current residence to where they will relocate.
- Transitory Family Support Package
 of Php 10,000.00 to Php 70,000.00 to
 cover food and non-food items needed by
 the family during their transition. Non-food
 items include clothes, school supplies,
 hygiene kits, and other essentials.
- Livelihood Settlement Grants of up to Php 50,000.00 as start-up capital for the establishment or continuity of livelihood and economic activities for eligible families or families that cannot be covered by support from other government agencies.

- Transitory Shelter Assistance in the form of rental subsidy amounting to Php 120,000.00 to Php 250,000.00 per year, for up to two years, while awaiting NHA housing to be constructed or awarded.
- Psychosocial Support through dialogues and specialized sessions for the family in preparation for the reintegration to their hometowns.
